

As there has been some confusion about IXL this past week, we wanted to give you some guidance with this program.


IXL consists of two different programs, "Learning" and "Diagnostic," each having their own "tab" on the IXL homepage.



The **Learning** portion of the program allows teachers to assign specific skills, usually associated with current instruction that is taking place in the classroom. We use this to reinforce classroom instruction, provide additional practice, and to help students become more confident in a particular skill. In the "Learning" portion of the program, students will complete the entire lesson, reaching a score of 100, though not necessarily in one setting. We will send an IXL assignment sheet *if* students are to complete lessons in this part of the program, usually math assignments.

The **Diagnostic** portion of the program is independent of classroom instruction. It assesses students on a continuing basis and assigns "recommendations" for the students to complete that are based on the program's assessment. There will not be an assignment sheet given for this portion of the program as the program itself generates the instructional path for the students. Students will simply open the "Diagnostic Tab" and scroll down to their "recommendations" and begin working.

Students should work on the "recommendations" in their lowest scoring strand.

Scroll down for ELA strands.

When we are in school, students have a 30-40 minute block of time each day to work on the Diagnostic portion of the program. Students will not necessarily "complete" a lesson during that time. They will pick up where they left off the next time they are on the program. You will see "IXL ELA" and "IXL Math" on their "Daily Checklist." This is referring to the Diagnostic part of the program students should spend 15-20 minutes in ELA and 15-20 minutes in Math each day.

We hope this helps. Students should be independent (except possibly the youngest students) in getting into the program. We have been using the "Learning" portion since last year and the Diagnostic portion since early October. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, don't hesitate to reach out. We are in the building every day zooming and preparing materials for the students. Someone will be available to help if needed. Thank you for all you're doing to help your students move forward.
